



DOMAINE MARC KREYDENWEISS

ANDLAU RIESLING

THE ESTATE: The Domaine Marc Kreydenweiss produces biodynamic wines in Alsace and in the Rhone Valley. The winery has been certified since 1989. Today, Kreydenweiss farms a little less than 30 acres of vineyards in Alsace, which include portions of 3 Grand Cru vineyards: Kastelberg, Moenchberg, and Weibelsberg. Riesling, Pinot Gris, and Pinot Blanc dominate the plantings, but Kreydenweiss has other varieties planted, included a small plot of Chardonnay.

LOCATION: Situated in an area contiguous to Wiebelsberg

PRODUCTION AREA: 125 ares

SOIL: Pink sandstone Vosges soil

GRAPE VARIETAL: 100% Riesling

ANNUAL PRODUCTION: 700 cases

TASTING NOTES: This is the Village Riesling-light golden color, youthful nose with a medium-pronounced intensity. Jammy and yet very fresh aroma of peach and apricot. Dry on the palate, medium acidity. Medium body with intense mineral and peach flavors. Well balanced Riesling.

CELLARING POTENTIAL: Ready to drink but can age for 3-4 more years
